In addition, we are very happy to have Temerza Mehretab back with us this year in the role of Site Support Instructor (SSI). Temerza served as teacher of a Grade 2/3 Blend last year, but we lost this position due to funding cuts. Fortunately, we were able to keep Temerza in this new position that is designed to support classrooms that need a substitute teacher and provide additional support to classrooms and students throughout the school.

For this school year we are continuing as a school staff to put a focus on providing our students an engaging and rigorous curriculum. ## Back to School Night – Wednesday, September 11 – 5:30-7:15pm





As most of you should know, we will be holding our Back-to-School Night next Wednesday, September 11 from 5:30-7:15pm. Back-to-School Night is a great opportunity to meet your child's teacher and to gather as a school community. The schedule for Back-to-School Night this year is as follows:

- 5:30-6:00pm Pizza and Salad Dinner in the Cafeteria (sponsored by the PTA)
- 6:00-6:15pm Whole School Gathering in the Auditorium
- 6:20-6:40pm Classroom Session #1
- 6:45-7:05pm Classroom Session #2

The purpose of the two classroom sessions is for parents with multiple children at James John to visit two classrooms and hear from both of their teachers. There will also be a resource fair in the gym during the evening with local community organizations present to share information. Unfortunately child care is not provided, but parents are able to bring their children to Back-to-School Night. We are fortunate at James John to be able to participate in the national AVID program at James John (<a href="https://www.avid.org/">https://www.avid.org/</a>). AVID stands for "Advancement Via Individual Determination" and is a program to support students to develop the study skills and habits and academic mindset to succeed in high school, college and career. AVID also has an explicit mission to lower the

achievement gap and insure that all students can access whatever life and career goals they desire. AVID has eight life skills (pictured above) that James John has adopted as our "Life Skills" this year. The first life skill that we are emphasizing in September is the skill of "organization." Through AVID, students in grades 3-5 receive a James John planner where they can write down their daily assignments, homework or other reminders. Students in grades K-2 have received a clear plastic folder to facilitate home school communication. We will be sharing more information about AVID throughout the school year and please work with your child this month on the skill of organization!

## **Parking and Driving Around James John School**

As our school year gets underway, we would like to remind parents who drop off and pick up their students to please be kind and considerate of our neighbors.

Please avoid the common, yet dangerous, traffic violations and do your part to keep all students safe. Kids are especially vulnerable on the street during the beginning and end of school due to the amount of traffic and people around campus. Please do not block driveways (Portland Bureau of Transportation States: You cannot block a paved or unpaved driveway including the curb returns or wings, even if the driveway has gates, chains, posts, or other barriers. Parking in these areas may be subject to citation), fire hydrants (Portland Bureau of Transportation States: You cannot park within 10 feet of a fire hydrant in any location. The fire hydrant does not have to be posted by signs or a yellow curb), or double park while waiting for your child. To address this issue, school pick-up and drop-off areas have been designed to increase the visibility and safety of our students. Also, please remember to practice safe, conscientious driving habits around school for everyone's safety: follow speed limits, avoid U-turns on streets near school, stop for crossing guards, and turn your key and be idle free.

### **PTA News**

Your PTA is ready for another great year! We have several events on tap for the first several weeks of school, so let's dive in...

First up is Back to School Night on Wednesday, September 11th. The PTA is providing dinner in the cafeteria from 5:30 to 6pm. 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## Student Rights, Responsibilities, and Discipline Handbooks

#### Hello PPS Families!

We have undergone some exciting changes in PPS over the summer. We have worked to improve our discipline and substance use policies and administrative directives to make them more supportive, restorative, and equitable. We have also hired a new Title IX (the federal law that makes it illegal to discriminate against someone on the basis of their gender) director, and have included her revisions as well. In order to incorporate all of these changes in to the Student Rights, Responsibilities, and Discipline Handbook, the handbook will be coming to you later than usual.

We will be adding translated versions as they become available. Once the handbooks are printed, we will send them out to schools, who will send them home to you.
