# **Presenting the PPS Vision**

That is one of the conclusions of the months-long process to create a Vision for PPS. In fall 2018, the Board of Education and the Superintendent of PPS launched a community-wide process to develop a long-term Vision for public education in Portland. This Vision, created after dozens of community meetings involving hundreds of stakeholders, describes PPS goals for the graduating class of 2030, and the educational experience that will increasingly be the reality for each of our graduates from 2019 onward.

## **New Outdoor Classroom at James John**

Some of you may have noticed our new "outdoor classroom" at James John this year. This outdoor classroom consists of nine benches surrounded by trees next to our turf field on the playground. This project was completed over the summer and was the culmination of planning that began in 2007 during the James John Playground Master Planning process. James John teachers had voiced that they wanted an outdoor space to bring their classes for lessons. James John parent Joseph Purkey created the design for the classroom and the project was finally begun last school year. The total cost for the project was just under \$10,000 and was funded thanks to a generous donation from a James John alumnus. # **MAP Growth Testing at James John**

## MAP Growth Testing – through September –Testing in Math and Reading – Grades 1-5

James John is continuing to use a new computerized assessment called MAP that will be used for all students in Grades 1-5 in both Math and Reading. The test is adaptive and is used as a diagnostic tool to measure individual levels and provides activities for improvement. After taking an initial test this month, students will take the assessment two more times during the school year to measure students' improvement over time. # Free or Reduced Lunch Applications & Title 1 Funding – due by October 9<sup>th</sup> & Annual Title 1 Parent Meeting- October 15<sup>th</sup> @ 8:15am

James John is fortunate to receive Title 1 funding based on the percentage of families in the school that qualify for Free or Reduced Lunch (FRL). Based on last school year's applications, we received just over \$120,000 this school year which we have used to fund staff positions to provide intervention as well as extra instructional materials. This is a reminder to all families to turn your FLR applications in to the cafeteria by October 9th if you think you might qualify for Free or Reduced Lunch. ## School Climate: Building a positive environment for all

School climate refers to a schools attention to fostering safety; promoting a supportive academic, disciplinary, and physical environment; and encouraging and maintaining respectful, trusting, and caring relationships throughout the school community. At James John that means we work on building lasting relationships with our students, our families, and with each other. We do this through a variety of methods that many of you are very familiar with. Below is a list of the bigger ways we provide positive feedback to our students.

- Pride of the Pride slips
- Weekly Lion Pride awards
- Student of the month awards
- Pling (our plastic tokens that go on their necklaces)
- Restorative circles
- Small group counseling
- Classroom guidance

We are also a restorative justice (RJ) focus school. We have an RJ Coach that meets with our staff 2 times each month. Classroom teachers are starting their days with a community circle to build community and relationship. Students then are familiar with the format and when an issue arises we are able to do some restorative work around conflict or harm and moving away from a more punitive disciplinary approach.

Finally, we are always looking for new ways to promote a positive climate at James John. If you have suggestions or concerns feel free to contact me through email or voicemail. I have contacted the PTA volunteer coordinator and are looking at having parents bring back our running club. The running club was very motivating to many of our students. And a way that students build up their Pling necklaces.
