Happy October to you all! Its hard to believe that we are in October already and fall is upon us. I hope you will enjoy this newsletter with a summary of what has been going on at James John and what lies ahead in the coming weeks and months.

It is hard to believe that just two weeks ago our whole school raised our voices in support of the Global Climate Strike on September 20. It was great to see all of our classes outside participating in our school march and we loved the support from all of the parents and community members who cheered us on. Maestro Renato Parada added to the spirit by providing some energized drumming and Mr. Doug Sammons was especially creative in leading chants with his Kindergarten students (i.e."Whose earth? Our Earth?"), Mr. Longfellow guided students in Art class to create some amazing signs and posters. Students in Mr. Musgnung's 5th grade class take the prize for the catchiest chant, "Save the turtles-Save-Save-the turtles." This chant has caught fire and can be heard consistently around the school since the march. We plan to keep this momentum going and lend our voices to important issues impacting our local and global community.

Looking ahead, we are excited for two big school events later this month; the Harvest Festival on

October 24 and the Dia de los Muertos Celebration on October 30. I give much appreciation to our PTA and Padres Latinos groups for their hard work and dedication in organizing these events. It is so wonderful to gather and celebrate together as one community. I wish you all a great month ahead.

James John Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBAC) 2019-20 Results

A few weeks ago, the State of Oregon released the results of the Smarter Balanced Assessment Consortium (SBAC) exam for the 2018-19 school year. James John students in grades 3-5 took this exam last May in both Math and English Language Arts. 5th grade students also took an assessment in Science.

Overall, looking at the results of the SBAC for James John, there were both positive results as well as results that show we need to continue to improve. Overall, 38% of our grades 3-5 students are performing at grade level or above in Language Arts (and this was a 4% increase from the prior year and 8% increase over two years). In Mathematics, 29% of our students are performing at grade level or above and this was a 1% increase from the prior year and a 5% increase over two years.

Analyzing these results, it is clear there is more work to do to raise the proficiency percentage for all of our students. This year we have been working as a school staff to strengthen our curriculum under a "Guaranteed and Viable Curriculum" model that is tightly aligned to the Common Core Standards. We have recently implemented a new English Language Arts curriculum (Lucy Caulkins' Readers and Writers Workshop) and we are making refinements to our major Math curricula (Bridges and Engaged New York). We feel that both these curricula combined with our skilled and talented teaching staff make us poised to continue the growth we have been making in these past few years. I will be sharing more information about these assessment results at the October 15 PTA meeting and at other times throughout the year.

Reminder - Free or Reduced Lunch Applications & Title 1 Funding – due by October 9th & Annual Title 1 Parent Meeting- October 15th @ 8:15am

James John is fortunate to receive Title 1 funding based on the percentage of families in the school that qualify for Free or Reduced Lunch (FRL). Based on last school year's applications, we received just over \$120,000 this school year which we have used to fund staff positions to provide intervention as well as extra instructional materials. This is a reminder to all families to turn your FLR applications in to the cafeteria by October 9th if you think you might qualify for Free or Reduced Lunch. If you are interested in learning more about the Title 1 programs and funding at our school, please attend our Annual Title 1 Parent Meeting on October 15th @ 8:15am in the school auditorium.

Some important tips for families on completing applications:

- Include all students on applications. Some families are only listing one student rather than all students on the application.
- Include all members in the household. Some families do not list other family members on the application, such as a grandparent, who may be living in the household. This can make a difference in whether they are eligible for meal benefits.
- Online applications are easier and faster for the team to process because it requires all information to be on the application and is readable.
- Even if the students are not choosing to eat school meals, being eligible for free or reduced price meals can also make them eligible to receive many fee reductions or waivers in other areas both in the district and in the community.

Math Instructional Specialist

As the Math Instructional Specialist at James John, I often have parents come to me expressing worry about their children not having their math facts memorized. This idea of needing to memorize is something that many of us encountered as children ourselves when we were in school. And, often, memories of timed tests and the pressure associated with them bring up feelings of stress and anxiety. Fortunately, there has been a ton of research in the years since that tells us that simply memorizing math facts does not ensure, or even encourage, mathematical understanding. What children need is time to work with counting objects, creating and breaking apart groups and representing and visualizing numbers in many ways. This practice will ensure students become fluent and flexible with numbers and comfortable with mathematics.

We all want our children to feel successful in school and much of that depends on how we encourage them in ways that will build knowledge and confidence. So what are some fun ways to do this? Instead of using flash cards have your child count objects you see on a walk, in your home, or at the store. Play questioning games like, "How long will it take me to brush my teeth?" or "If I have five crackers and I eat 2 how many will I have left?" The more we talk to children and help them experience math in their everyday lives, the more confident and fluent they will become. Because, after all, children and adults alike want learning to be meaningful and fun!
