## Getting Home...

On the Release of Information, there are two options available: Pick-up by parent only or student's discretion (walk, bike, Tri-Met, parent, activity bus).

## **Program Descriptions**

#### **MONDAY & WEDNESDAY CLASSES**

Study Hall (Monday & Wednesday, 3:50 - 4:50) Ms. Raspone: Library

Frustrated with your assignments and need a quiet place to study? Spend some time dedicated to schoolwork with help from friendly school teachers, SUN instructors, and Reed College tutors!

Creative Art (Monday & Wednesday, 3:50 - 4:50) Erica Katz: Rm 183

Join this group to expand on skills and concepts learned in art class. Students will work on exciting and creative art projects while making new friends!

ETS (Portland State University) (Monday ONLY, 3:50 - 4:50) Ashley Echang: Rm 180 ETS (Educational Talent Search) is a fun and interactive pre-college program provided by Portland State University. In this after school program, the kids will be engaged in various projects, activities, and field-trips throughout the school year intended to keep students motivated and encouraged to go to college!

Hip Hop Dance Class (Monday ONLY, 3:50 - 4:50) Isabelle Chen: Stage

A class for dancers of all levels of experience. Students will work up a sweat while grooving to different styles of Hip Hop music and discovering their personal style. Will start out with a warm-up, short strength building workout, and then focus on choreography.

Girls Inc. (<u>Wednesday ONLY</u>, 3:50 - 5:45) Rm 175

Discover your inner scientist with Operation SMART! Have fun with hands-on science, engineering, and technology projects in this weekly group just for girls! Learn about careers in the STEM (science, technology, engineering, and math) fields and try new things while playing games and working on fun projects with other girls.
