Nutrition Services would like to thank you for your support and participation in the breakfast and lunch programs at Richmond, our program would not be possible without you. Our staff, Nga and Emi, love greeting your children with a smile while serving them delicious, nutrient-rich meals each and every day.

We are asking for all Richmond families to please double check their account balances before the end of the school year. In general, email or letter notifications are sent out weekly to notify families of negative account balances, but you can always check with the Richmond kitchen staff in person. To ensure a positive account balance, payments can be made by cash or



check at the school cafeteria or with a debit/credit card online at www.SchoolCafe.com. NOTE: There is a 5% convenience fee per transaction charged by SchoolCafe to add funds electronically to your student's account. To avoid this charge you can bring cash or check to your school's cafeteria.

Families who meet federal income guidelines, can submit a meal application anytime during the school year to see if they qualify for free or reduced price meal benefits. Families are responsible for any meal charges incurred prior to the application being approved.


#### COUNSELORS CORNER カウンセラーからのお知らせ

Our school has accepted the challenge of helping to find a cure for Blood Cancer! We are joining over 29,000 schools across the nation to make a difference and raise as much money as we can! Over the next 2 weeks our

school will be working to reach a goal of \$3,000. A letter has been sent home to parents on 4/12 that talks about the Pennies for Patients coin drive.

The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society's mission is to cure leukemia, lymphoma, Hodgkin's disease and myeloma and improve the quality of life of patients and their families. Many treatments discovered through LLS funding are now used for many other diseases. Donations from Pennies for Patients help families of patients pay for medicines, doctors or other expenses, and also help fund research focused on finding a cure. Our coins go to the Portland LLS chapter and local families.



This is Richmond's 5th year with Student Council running the Pennies

for Patients coin drive, and our community has donated over \$10,000 in total! Wow! Students can bring in coins to their classroom collection box through Friday April 27. 
