Dear Roseway Heights Community,

As I write this message, I have just finished signing the certificates for our Middle School Honor Roll assembly that will happen at school this week. Because of the nature of my job, it is easy to see the school through the lens of conflict and crisis, problems and issues. However, like many of our students and teachers, I consciously choose to shift my perspective by seeking out the best our school has to offer – and there is a lot! My hand is nearly cramping from signing so many certificates, because over 40% of our middle school students made our honor roll for the first quarter. To be on our honor roll a student must have earned a 3.5 or higher grade point average. To have a school where 40% of middle school students are able to do that is impressive! And although it is in middle school that students begin to earn letters grades, a K-8 school cannot have that kind of success unless the K-5 program feeding the middle school is solid. It is clear to me that our teachers from Kinder up through the 5th grade are doing an excellent job of preparing our students to be successful when they get into our middle school program.

For those of you getting to know me, however, you also know that I believe our work has only begun. I know we have teachers at every grade level that go that extra step (sometimes an extra mile or two!) to connect with a student, or offer an alternative way to understand a concept, or support a student who is struggling – and they will continue to support those students until every student in our school is able to achieve academic excellence. And while we are ready to celebrate the accomplishments of our successful students, we also met as a teaching team to look at students that are not being as successful and worked on strategies to engage them more fully in our program. For all of our students, we are constantly looking at work produced in class to quickly identify areas students need to work on and areas where they are ready to accelerate. We meet in small teams to share ideas and plan together – all in an effort to figure out what is going to help all of our students feel the success they are capable of reaching.

As we hunker down to these last few weeks before our winter break, take some time to talk to your student about what they are learning, ask them what they are excited about, find out where they are struggling. It is important that everybody stay engaged in the success of every student, and asking questions is a crucial step in that process. Hopefully everyone had things to be thankful for over the long Thanksgiving break. I for one am thankful I get to serve in this community, and although I am tired of signing my name, I look forward to many more honor roll assemblies and even more certificates!





Music News and Updates!

Dear Parents,

Our music programs are moving at full steam.

The Band has been completely outfitted. The students worked hard to develop a balanced band with trombones, drums and percussion, Saxes, trumpets, clarinets, bass guitar, and flutes. It's very exciting. We have had a number of advanced players come and join our group to provide sectionals and individual attention. By now, the students are playing exercises 1-39. Please ask them to play some pieces for you. Remember they are required to practice 50 minutes a week or 10 min a day. They need to be completing their practice sheets and turning them in at the first class of the week. Also, we still have a few parents that need to complete their rental contracts and get them turned in. The district is anxious for us to have those completed and submitted. On the up side the band has put together a good set of music and will perform in the MPR on Friday, Dec. 16th at 2:30 to kick of the winter break.

The Choirs have been working on a nice variety of music from Gospel, to a WWI memorial piece, some movie music, and a beautiful choral piece entitled "Glorious" written by David Archuleta the American Idol star. The 7th and 8th grade singers have done their first performance here at RWH in the center hall as students arrived. They sang Shalom Chaverim and an African piece Si Si Si. They provided good feedback about their work during class. We have also had an award winning choir director Doree Jarboe come and work with the students to help them practice part singing. Both middle school choirs will be performing at the Zoo Lights on December 7th at 6:30PM, and then at Madison High School on December 15th at 7:00PM. In preparation, Mr. Owens will bring the Madison choir over on Thursday December 1st to rehearse together. We are singing Lennon/McCartney Blackbird and Si Si Si with the Madison Choir.

Lastly, our elementary musicians have hit a new high in music development, incorporating the appropriate folk dances with their American folk music studies. It represents a huge growth point for all of them especially considering where we started two years ago. Their rhythm studies have progressed to new highs, their singing using solfege has gotten up to grade level, and all elementary grades are working on creating music individually and as an ensemble. I'm very proud to be on staff at Roseway Heights and have our music program expanding and growing. Our elementary music program is planned for February, more on that later.
