Dear Roseway Heights families,

It is hard to believe but next week is the mid point of this first quarter of the school year! As we approach October, it will be necessary to check your calendar, as there are a lot of important school events taking place during this month. If you were unable to come to our Back to School Night, please try to connect with your child's teacher to get signed up for a conference time for Parent Teacher Conferences. These take place on Oct. 21 and 22.

We are using the emails that you have provided as part of the student information filled out by you for your child. If your information has changed and you haven't had a chance to return the Student Verification form that went home at the beginning of school, please send that in, because being able to communicate with a student's family is critical for us. If any information changes during the year, you can call the office to update our records.

We are definitely getting into our new routines. The kindergarteners are adjusting very well to figuring out how to navigate the cafeteria. Thank you to all the volunteers who have come in to help with this. Please remember, when you are picking up a student at the end of the day, wait until the bell rings before walking down the hallway. We are often transitioning classes very close to the end of the day and want to make sure the entire class makes it to their destination and doesn't get separated or distracted from where they are going. Thank you to everyone who is helping with the traffic flow and ensuring our Safety Patrollers are able to do their jobs. Not stopping to drop off or pick up students on Siskiyou is really helping.

Safety reminders: when you come to check out your child or bring some item they need (lunch, homework, etc.), please come to the office and we will bring your child to you and/or make sure the item gets delivered to them. Our instructional time is precious, so we want to minimize disruptions as much as possible by not having lots of coming and going from the classrooms. This is also a safety issue by having everyone consistently come to the office. If you are staying to volunteer or to have lunch with your child, you must sign in and wear the volunteer/visitor badge so that it is readily visible. We appreciate your help with this!

#### SCHOOL MEAL APPLICATIONS

Students who were receiving free or reduced-price meal benefits at the end of last year must fill out a **<u>new</u>** meal application for the 2015-16 school year. If benefits are denied or reduced when the new application is approved, families will have ten days before the change in eligibility takes effect.

Students who have NOT submitted a <u>new</u> application will be required to pay full price for school meals starting Mon., Oct. 12, 2015.

#### **APPLE SALE**

Like to bake desserts? Need apples for lunches? Roseway Heights PTA can help! The PTA is proud to be selling apples and pears from Kiyokawa Farms for its newest fundraiser.

Kiyokawa Family Orchards is a family-owned and operated farm located in Parkdale, Oregon, growing produce since 1911. Kiyokawa Family Orchards takes pride in promoting local and sustainably-grown produce and utilizing a farm management system that incorporates best management practices.

These orders are by the box. A box of apples weighs 20-22 pounds. A box of pears weighs 22-25 pounds. That makes our fruit cost around \$1.50 per pound, which is a fantastic deal for high quality, local produce - cheaper than the farmer's market.

If you have storage for your apples (refrigerator or cool basement), the apples will last a long time. If you don't have storage for them, plan to use them sooner (for pies, canning, etc) or share a box with a friend! Order forms went home in backpacks on Sept. 18. Extra forms are available in the office.

#### SCRIP PROGRAM

Whether you're a returning RWH family, or brand new to our community, you've likely heard of Scrip. So what exactly is Scrip? It's fun, it's easy, and it raises thousands of dollars for our school!.

Simply put, Scrip means gift cards and gift certificates. It's a dollar-for-dollar value exchange, where you purchase a gift card or gift certificates from one of our participating retailers. The best part? These retailers contribute anywhere from a 4-43% rebate to our school on the sale of the gift cards. It's really as simple as that. You buy the gift card at face value, and our school gets money!

#### So how do you purchase Scrip?

**Option 1**: Complete an order form. Personal orders are placed weekly on Tuesday morning. Completed order forms including payment (cash or check made out to RWH Scrip) can be dropped into our Scrip envelope in the school office no later than Tuesday at 8 a.m. Order forms can be picked up in the school office, from the Scrip desk, or electronically on the PTA Facebook page.

**Option 2**: Stop by the West entrance after school to purchase directly from our desk. We are open M-W-F from 2-2:30 p.m. We keep all our bestsellers on hand: Fred Meyer's, New Seasons, Papa Murphy's, Safeway, Pizzicato, Petco, Amazon, Starbucks and more! We also sell Chinook Books. Sales at the desk are cash or check only.

Please try Scrip. It's one of the easiest ways to fundraise for our school. Last year our teachers used profits to fund almost entirely our school field trips. Remember, we're not asking you to purchase something you don't need or want. But this way, everyone can contribute and do their part – it's individual-based shopping! What could be better?
