These last weeks of school will be busy ones! All of our 8<sup>th</sup> graders have selected classes for their first year of high school. Our promotion will be held on **June 15<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 pm** at Madison High School with a short reception following. We will be wrapping up our small groups and lessons in the next few weeks. The fifth grade will be finishing sessions on Readiness for Middle School and the 6th and 8th grade are having presentations on Digital/Media Safety. As we near the end of school, I wanted to include a reminder about the importance of attendance. We are seeing an increase in the number of tardies. Being here and being on time continues to be very important!

#### DID YOU KNOW?

- Starting in kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school.
- Missing 10 percent (or about 18 days) can make it harder to learn to read.
- Students can still fall behind if they miss just a day or two days every few weeks.
- Being late to school may lead to poor attendance.
- Absences can affect the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down learning to help children catch up.

Attending school regularly helps children feel better about school – and themselves. Start building this habit in preschool so they learn right away that going to school on time, every day is important. Good attendance will help children do well in high school, college, and at work.

### Walk and Bike Challenge begins this Monday!


