Dear Wilson Friends and Families,

School funding has improved in Oregon, and PPS this fall benefitted from unexpected revenues of over \$16 million. Sounds good (and it is) but keep in mind that over the past 15 years funding has declined so steeply that Oregon is now well below national average in per-student spending. Although school funding has improved slightly and the economy is in recovery, Oregon is still behind the curve in funding a quality education for our children.

The Wilson Foundation raises money to pay for additional teachers at Wilson. Do you value a breadth of elective offerings and reasonable class sizes? Do you value a strong high school in our community that engages students and prepares them to be successful after graduation? Then **please make a contribution to the Wilson Foundation.** We rely on our community to bridge the gap between adequate and excellent.

Thanks to your support in past years we have been able to add elective courses, reducing class size and increasing choices for students, keeping them in school and engaged.
