PRACTICE ACT TEST, MONDAY, JANUARY 25, 9:30AM-12:30PM—SIGN UP TODAY!

The Wilson Counseling Department is offering a Kaplan ACT practice test at Wilson High School for just \$10. All Wilson Juniors will take the ACT on Tuesday, March 15, so take advantage of this opportunity to prepare. This practice test is proctored just like an actual test, except that the score is not recorded or reported to colleges. Like the SAT, the ACT exam is a national college-readiness exam. Almost every college uses ACT scores in their admissions process. Taking the ACT can also open the door to scholarships or other financial aid that can make college more affordable.
