Please join us for a free screening of the documentary *Lessons of Basketball and War*. The panel discussion following the screening will include the film's director/writer/producer, Ron Bourke.

This hour-long documentary explores universal themes of violence, prejudice, cultural identity and conflict resolution as seen through the eyes of adolescent girls—refugees from war and famine in Somalia who have resettled in a strange foreign city. Pushed together in an inner city housing project, the refugees find their religious traditions and beliefs tested by the onslaught of a sexualized, celebrity-obsessed America. Teachers work to help students with little previous education and a propensity for an abhorrent form of personal violence fueled by a legacy of ethnic hostilities. *Lessons of Basketball and War* offers an engaging and at times thrilling account of a year in these young lives and the challenges faced by one dedicated educator, peacemaker and basketball coach.
