PORTLAND/BOLOGNA SISTER ASSOCIATION (PBSCA) YOUTH EXCHANGE SEEKS HOST FAMILIES

Portland families with current sophomores (preferably) are needed to host teens from Bologna, Italy, for the first two weeks in July 2016. The PBSCA exchange is a small (limited to nine), reciprocal, alternating exchange between the City of Bologna, Italy, and Portland. Participating 16-17 year olds from both Portland and Bologna host one summer and travel the alternating summer. There is no need to be able to speak Italian, the students from Bologna all speak English.

This summer is Portland's turn to host. PBSCA works with families to create an itinerary of structured and informal activities to help those with busy summer schedules ensure there is something for their visitor to do. Host siblings participating for the first time this summer will be eligible to travel to Bologna in the summer of 2017. In Bologna, Portland teens stay with Italian host families and are offered a great program of activities that typically include trips to Florence and Venice. Participants pay for airfare and out-of-pocket expenses but their living costs and the cost of formal activities are covered.
