PSAT TESTING DAY

All Sophomores and Juniors will take the PSAT exam starting at 8:15am and ending at 11:30am. The math and social studies halls will be reserved for testing and only students taking the PSAT will be admitted to these halls. Signs in the main hall starting October 12th will tell students their testing room. Students need to bring their ID, 2 sharpened pencils and an approved calculator (<https://www.collegeboard.org/psat-nmsqt/approved-calculators>).

Freshmen and Seniors will attend class assemblies while Sophomores and Juniors are taking the test. The Freshman Assembly is from 8:15-11:30am in the Gym and will focus on the prevention of bullying.
