WILSON ATHLETES OF THE WEEK, MAY 2-6



Alex Slenning had a historic week for Wilson Track and Field. Last Saturday Alex bested our 32 year-old school record in the 3000 by almost 10 seconds in a time of 8:33. On Wednesday he ran the 9th-fastest 800 in school history in 1:57. Then on Friday night at the Twilight Relays Alex ran the second fastest 1500 in school history, 3:58, en route to running a 4:14 mile.

Ryleigh Crenshaw set the Wilson school record in the pole vault with a jump of 10'9," and placed at the prestigious Jesuit Twilight Meet and Centennial Invitational.

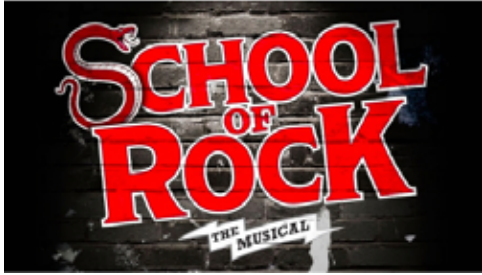
From Leanne Van Horn:
