A BIG DAY FOR WILSON CROSS COUNTRY!

“On Wednesday, October 27, the ‘Long Green Line’ showed up in force for the 2016 PIL District meet, with over 120 athletes competing in the toughest district race in the state.

The afternoon started off with the JV boys absolutely crushing the field and taking home 1st place! Sophomore **Caden Samkutty** led the entire way (start to finish) and brought home the individual championship as well. A strong pack of Trojans followed closely behind including: **Torsten Huesby**, **Nathan Rutledge-Gorman**, **Jacob Makuch** and **Mason Lommen**.

The JV girls finished a respectable 2nd place in a very competitive division. Wilson Freshmen **Avery Paulson** and **Autumn Darrah** both finished in the top ten of the division. Avery was fifth overall with a time of 21:02 and Autumn was seventh overall in a time of 21:19. The future is very bright for this group of young up and comers!

All seven of our Varsity boys (**Alex Slenning**, **Caleb Seely**, **Elius Graff**, **Finn Tyvoll**, **Kian Mitchell**, **Jackson Curtin** and **Aiden Manley**) all ran their hearts out and finished in a close second place to Lincoln and qualifying for a return trip to state. Junior **Alex Slenning** became a two-time district champion by pulling away from the field and finishing in an incredible time of 15:49. **Caleb Seeley** gave Alex a run for his money, closing in fast and finishing in second place with a time of 15:51.

To cap the day, our Varsity lady Trojans (**Francesca Ierulli**, **Grace Heizer**, **Annika Sundstrom**, **Adahra Poasa**, **Elle Stein**, **Zoe Anderson** and **Elsa Douglas**) finished second overall, qualifying for state! The girls team is not only an elite state-level team on the course, but they were awarded an OSAA Academic All-State Award as well, with a combined 3.88 GPA. Reading, Writing and Running!
