WILSON MUSIC DEPARTMENT WOWS THE CROWD (AGAIN!)

On January 12, Paul Jolstead and his music groups performed for an appreciative audience in the Cosgrove Auditorium. The students were resplendent in their black dresses and tuxedos. Special thanks to all the volunteers who helped make sure the dresses and slacks were the right length. The evening began with the Jazz Band. It started with a talented saxophone section with "Groove Merchant," a smooth, mellow piece that was a real toe-tapper. It moved to a slow, contemplative song, "Here's that Rainy Day," with a masterful solo by Andrew Bird. Mr. Jolstead continued his weather-themed program with "On the Sunny Side of the Street," which showcased the talented trumpet section. "In a Sentimental Mood" was mix of tempos, which soloist Colleen Moore deftly played. The final song, "Kicks N' Licks," was the quintessential jazz piece, with different soloists taking over to demonstrate their improvisational skills. Even though I am not a jazz fan, I liked everything they played. Concert Band then took the stage. It was hard to remember this group had only been playing together since September; they were that polished. Their first piece, "Eine Keine Machtmusik," was a good adaptation of an orchestral piece and worked well as a band piece. "The Little Drummer Boy' started with the percussion section, then built intensity adding other instruments along the way. The drums had a consistent performance that accentuated the theme. "Winter Pastorale" by Bach was a slow, moving piece that was warmly received by the audience. The final song was led by the fall's student teacher, Briana Alston, in her farewell performance. This was a challenging piece that the band played with good dynamics and skill. The future of Wilson music looks bright if these students are any indication. This was a tough act for the Wind Ensemble to follow, but they held up their end of the bargain. The impressive number of kids shows there is no lack of enthusiasm for music at Wilson. Their first piece, "Patapan," was a jazzy rendition of a Christmas favorite. In "Moorside March," I could really hear the new tuba of which Mr. Jolstead is so proud. Crisp, clear notes were a joy to hear in Themes from "Green Bushes." It started with the tuba and euphoniums and added instruments until the flutes and clarinets were included. It brought to mind an epic moment in a blockbuster movie. Mr. Jolstead described the next piece, "October," as "cinematic," which is an apt description. It combined a sweeping, contemplative melody with emotion and inspiration. The evening ended with "Auld Lang Syne." I am sure I was not alone when I wanted to start singing along. This song brought chills to my spine. The audience gave Mr. Jolstead and his students a boisterous, well-deserved round of applause.
