Wilson was informed that **Ian Alevy '09** was one of a select few University of Chicago freshmen who were placed ahead one full year in their University mathematics program this Autumn. Wilson "has contributed significantly to this student's progress in mathematics... we respect and appreciate the excellent teaching of mathematics being done in your Department," adds Diane Hermann, Co-Director of Undergraduate Studies, The University of Chicago. WILSON CHEER HEADS TO STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS, FEBRUARY 13

The Wilson HIgh Varsity Cheerleaders are headed to the Oregon State Championships February 13 to defend their 2009 6A State Championship. Once again the team has proven they are poised for another 1st. In the past three weeks of competitions leading up to this weekend the girls have taken 1st each time including Grand Campions at the Extreme Challenge in Salem. "We would love to continue the tradition of Wilson having the biggest and loudest cheering section at the Memorial Coliseum," adds Chris Fazzolari, head cheer coach. WILSON STUDENTS ACHIEVE ADVANCED PLACEMENT SUCCESS

Each year Wilson students who want to learn and achieve at the highest level become Advanced Placement students. Through these courses and exams, they earn college credit and advanced placement, and stand out in the admissions process.

In 2009, Wilson students registered for 475 AP tests. This was 28% of the total number of tests taken by PPS students.

In 2009, 76% of Wilson students scored 3 or better on the AP exam which qualifies them for earning college credit at accepting institutions.

In 2009, 37 Wilson students earned AP Scholar recognition for receiving grades of 3 or higher on at least three different AP exams.

In 2009, 15 Wilson students earned AP Scholar with Honor recognition for receiving an average grade of at least 3.25 on all AP exams taken and grades of 3 or more on at least four different AP exams taken.

In 2009, 23 Wilson students earned AP Scholar with Distinction recognition for receiving and average grade of at least 3.5 on all AP exams taken and grades of 3 or higher on at least five different AP exams taken.

In 2009, 2 Wilson students earned National AP Scholar recognition for earning an average grade of at least 4 on all AP exams taken and grades of 4 or higher on at least eight AP exams.
