WRESTLERS TAKE DOWN PIL ONE MORE TIME ... AND HEAD TO STATE

The Wilson Wrestlers are PIL District Champions for the 4th consecutive year!! After leading the first three rounds, Wilson fell behind Grant by 10 points in the 4th. The Wilson Wrestlers exploded in the final round, 17 out of the 24 wrestlers winning their final match. Wilson outscored Grant; 63.5 to 35.5 in the 5th round. Final Scores: Wilson 305, Grant 287, Benson 225, Lincoln 141 and Franklin 45. For the first time in Wilsons history all 24 of the Wilson Wrestlers entered in the District Tournament placed in the top 6. Thirteen Wilson students will be representing our school in their respective weight categories at the 2010 OSAA Wrestling State Championships, February 25-27 at the Memorial Coliseum in Portland. As a member of Portland Aquatic Club since 1998, he trains six days a week with the Senior Team. In addition, Dana has been on the Wilson swim team for four years. He is thrilled to have won the 100 fly this past weekend at HS States. He says, "Swimming has given me self confidence and makes me feel strong, empowered and capable of achieving anything I put my mind to.
