DOES YOUR STUDENT NEED HEATHCARE?

Earlier this year, you received information about Multnomah County Health Department's School-Based Health Center (SBHC) program. They are here to assist your family in getting the healthcare they need. Their clinics are like any medical office, but they specialize in caring for school-aged children. School-based health centers are funded through third-party insurance, Medicaid, grants and public funds. Families/students call directly to one of the SBHC sites to make an appointment. They request that students needing health care aim for one of their SBHC sites that are in a school that serves their grades, or you can call them and they will help you figure out which SBHC site to go to. Cost: there is no cost for any of their services. They do ask for health insurance information so they can bill insurance. If a family does not have health insurance, they do not pay for the care provided by the SBHC. Or if the health insurance company does not pay them, the family does not have to pay the bill.
