WILSON STUDENTS TAKE THE STAGE FOR IMPRESSIVE CONCERT

The Instrumental Music Department treated an enthusiastic audience to a wonderful concert on Wednesday, April 14. The evening started with the **Chamber Orchestra**, comprised of dedicated musicians who arrive at school early three mornings a week to rehearse. They may be small in number, but their talent and abilities are anything but small. Their intimate performance started with the theme from the movie "Amadeus," by Mozart. Each instrument could be heard and appreciated in this beautiful piece. A composition by Camille Saint-Saens followed, with some great percussion work by the violins. (They tapped their bows on their stands!) The concert master, Jordan Wu, did well on his solo. The cellos and violas provided a good counterpoint to the piece. Their portion of the evening ended too soon.

The Jazz Band was on next. Their first song, "Sidewinder", featured great solos by Andrew Bird on saxophone, Fiona Dearth on trumpet, and Alan Bishop on drums. Next was "April in Paris," a real toe-tapper. It is a beautiful song and was well done by the group. Solos were by Nathan Zelick on trombone, and Austin Casey on trumpet. "St. Thomas" followed, with a fine solo by Andrew Bird on saxophone. This piece had difficult rhythms but they played in time and all together. The band shifted gears to a ballroom style with "I Remember Clifford" featuring Austin Casey on trumpet. "Mr. Basket" rounded out the Jazz Band's set with solos by Andrew Bird on saxophone and Paul Kempler on Guitar. All that was needed by the Jazz Band was a microphone in the piano to amplify it's sound.

The **Concert Band** then took the stage, showing improvement even since the previous concert. They started with "Fanfare, Ode and Festival" which had an unconventional sound but they pulled it off. This piece highlighted the strong percussion section. They completed their portion of the evening with "Firefall." It did not fall short.

The premier group, **Wind Ensemble**, then finished off the evening in fine style. This performance was a dress rehearsal for the PIL Band Festival, hosted by Wilson the following day. The group showed the students in Concert Band what they can aspire to next year. They started with "New Colonial March," a rousing band tune that includes the school's fight song. It was all I could do to refrain from standing and singing along. They played with polish and good nuances. They changed the tempo to slow and thoughtful with "Blessed." The band demonstrated good dynamics with this piece. Themes from "Green Bushes" followed, a good showcase for the tuba and bari sax sections. The evening was completed by another Saint Saens composition, "Occident and Orient." This melodic piece brought to mind a string orchestra, but the strings were not missed. The wind instruments handled it well. It was a complex piece, but the band never lost the trail of the music. It was an impressive finish to an impressive concert.

PEDESTRIAN/BICYCLE IMPROVEMENTS PROJECTS - CALL FOR NOMINATIONS

Nomination of Hillsdale Pedestrian and bicycle Improvement Projects and process to determine our Hillsdale priorities. In July 2010, the Oregon Gas tax will increase. The funds collected will be shared with the City of Portland, COP. The COP has decided to spend most of the additional funds on pedestrian improvements, and a significant portion in SW Portland, because 45% of our arterials are substandard and we have few sidewalks. Just 15% of our SW streets have sidewalks. As chair of the Hillsdale Transportation committee, Don Baack has proposed the following process for collecting the projects we should consider be done in the next few years, and to establish priorities within various logical categories for funding street improvements. For example, it is clear to anyone who has tried to walk on Dosch that we need a place for pedestrians, and for bicycles going uphill. Due to the topography it is unlikely they will be able to fit a climbing bike lane in with an extended shoulder to walk on. But, we might be able to get an extended shoulder on the hill side of the street that would serve as both a climbing bike lane and a place for pedestrians to walk. Another category are those fixes that will require engineering before we can move to fix them. The pipeline of projects PBOT has ready to go next year is empty. That is one of the reasons some of the stimulus money was spent in areas that many did not view as priority locations for stimulus dollars. Sidewalks for Capitol Highway east to Terwilliger, on SW 18th and other places have long been on our priority list. So they are proceeding on a process to nominate candidate projects in the Hillsdale neighborhood, the intent is to include as many folks in this process as possible. They want the involvement of the PTA's, the Hillsale Business and Professional Association, (HBPA), The Hillsdale Alliance and all of our citizens. Nominations beyond those listed below need to be sent to Don Baack by May 17. Don and anyone else interested will then visit the sites and identify the length of the needed improvement and all the visible details about what is involved in making the improvement. Later in May and into June if necessary, they will have a couple of meetings to decide the categories they want, the criteria they should consider, and how they want to present our results. After the final meeting, they will present our results to the Hillsdale NA, the Hillsdale BPA, the Hillsdale Alliance the 3 PTA's and other Hillsdale organizations. Once they have their list complete, they can then lobby the appropriate organizations to get the funding for the projects.
