## WILSON ROWERS GOING TO NATIONAL COMPETITION

Several rowers from Wilson that compete as part of Rose City Rowing Club are on a crew that qualified for the US Jr. National Championships. The crew competed at the US Rowing NW Jr. Regionals this weekend at Vancouver Lake, finishing in the top 3 in the region (OR, WA, ID, N. Cal) and earning a spot to compete at Nationals in the Jr. Men's Varsity 8+ (8 rowers & 1 coxswain.) The crew going to Nationals includes Wilson Students:

Four of the other five in the boat also represent Portland Public Schools. Nationals are held in Cincinatti, OH June 9-13. WILSON STUDENTS TO DISCUSS SUBSTANCE ABUSE AT TOWN HALL MEETING, MONDAY, MAY 17 from 7 to 9 pm Please join the Wilson student group P.A.C.T. (Positive Action Concerning Teens), C.A.R.S.A (Community Action to Reduce Substance Abuse) and the Oregon Partnership at a Town Hall meeting on Monday, May 17 from 7 to 9 pm at the Saint Barnabas Church (2201 SW Vermont St.). Topics to be discussed include underage drinking, marijuana abuse, social hosting and Minor in Possession enforcement and consequences. This event is part of the Multnomah County Underage Drinking Pilot Project. This project engages students at Wilson to assess their community and execute a youth-led positive social norms media campaign that counters common misperceptions that lead to underage drinking and drug use. P.A.C.T (Positive Action Concerning Teens) is the satellite team at Wilson High School. Youth members have been meeting every week since December 2009 working on teambuilding skills, collecting data from fellow students and becoming student experts on local alcohol and drug issues. Hear information, learn more, discuss with community members and civic leaders, speak out. At the Town Hall our youth and their parents will be joined by community members from our local schools, neighborhoods, and businesses to discuss challenges and solutions surrounding underage substance use. P.A.C.T members are excited to share their research and survey results with you. ### **WILSON MATH TEACHER RECEIVES TWO GRANTS**

According to PPS, **Chris Bartlo**, math teacher at Wilson High School, has landed two grants that will benefit students in his classrooms. The James F. & Marion L. Miller Foundation awarded Chris \$4,900 to build a resource library for math, statistics and computer science at Wilson. Then private donors, through the online Donors Choose program, awarded Chris \$840 to purchase a document camera for his classroom. Chris said that the document camera, by Avermedia, has been an invaluable tool for him and his students and is used on a daily basis. Chris wrote the Donors Choose grant with a focus on using technology to help provide differentiated instruction and to allow students an opportunity to share work with each other. Chris' ambitions for funding continue. His next grant target is to get a Smartboard for his classroom, which he says will be useful in teaching "hands on" topics like geometry and systems dynamics. Chris is a first-year mathematics teacher hired to teach classes in system dynamics and computer modeling, in addition to other advanced mathematics courses. He graduated with a degree in science technology and society and mathematics from Pomona College and has a master's in systems science from Portland State University. He worked as a systems test engineer for International Game Technology and as a software developer for PSU before going into teaching. "We're lucky to have Chris here," said Wilson Principal Sue Brent. "His creativity and energy are serving his students and all of us at Wilson."

#### 1962 GRAD STILL PLAYING BASKETBALL

Karl Wustrack '62 played basketball and was on the cross/country and track teams while at Wilson. After he graduated from high school, Karl attended Stanford University and Yale University School of Medicine. He completed his general surgery residency at OHSU followed by a plastic surgery fellowship at UCLA. After returning to Portland, Karl began his plastic surgery practice and is still practicing in West Linn. Following his successes while at Wilson, Karl was inducted into the WWHS Sports Hall of Fame for Basketball and Cross-Country in 2008. He continues to stay active, playing masters basketball. Dr. Wustrack fondly remembers his teachers at Wilson. He tells us that "Troy Horton was maybe the best for getting us to think." But surprisingly, Al Ludviksen in wood shop was his favorite. Today, one of his passions is furniture making, "and it all started at Wilson, despite the councilors telling me I should take public speaking, etc," adds Karl. He also remembers his Physics teacher, Norm Sipple and Dorothy Sawyer and Brigitte DeWolfe in German. Words of advice for current Wilson students ... "just follow your interests, or as they say now "passion" -- you can do it a lot longer than you think!"
