WILSON COLLEGE-SPONSORED MERIT SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS NAMED

Wilson seniors garnered four of the National Merit Scholarships financed by colleges and universities this year. Only six PPS students received the college-sponsored merit scholarships. Winners announced today are among approximately 8,400 distinguished high school seniors of 2010 who will receive National Merit Scholarships worth \$36 million for college undergraduate study. Congratulations to these students and their dedicated parents, Charles and Laurie Funk; Molly Kellogg and Stanley Hollenberg; Leanne Palmer; and Sarah Armitage and Nolan Shishido.

The four Wilson students are:

- Jenica Funk received a National Merit University of Southern California Scholarship and plans to focus on International Relations/Diplomatic Service.
- Tommy Hollenberg received a National Merit Oregon State University Scholarship and plans to focus on Engineering. Tommy's parents and brother Clark Hollenberg, class of 2013, are thrilled that he, "will be able to pursue his quest for knowledge and meaning with less financial hardship thanks to the National Merit Scholarship. He could not have achieved this success without the help and support of some very special teachers and staff at Wilson. He is excited to begin this journey at OSU with many good friends from his class at Wilson."
- Zoe Palmer received a National Merit Northwestern University Scholarship. Northwestern University is a major teaching and research institution whose undergraduate campus is located in Evanston, Illinois. Zoe's entire family is proud of her accomplishments and "so pleased at her acceptance and scholarship to Northwestern University," states Leanne Palmer, Zoe's mother. "I'd like to acknowledge the hard work of her many excellent teachers at Wilson as well!"

WOMEN'S LACROSSE FINISHES SECOND IN STATE PLAYOFFS

The Wilson Women's Lacrosse team powered through the playoffs last week, completing its strongest season ever with a final record of 17 wins and 3 losses. Wilson came from behind in the semi-final game to upset #2 Lakeridge 15-14 in the final seconds on a goal by senior co-captain **Emily Zweber**. Zweber led the Wilson scoring with four goals and an assist, and was joined by senior co-captain **KK McCaslin** with four goals, junior attack **Fiona Dearth** with three goals, junior attack **Emily Sauter** with two goals and four assists, and a goal each by juniors **Mckenzie Hessel** and **Ceara Leo**. All-PIL Goalie **Brittany Bohnert** again had a standout game with an astonishing 19 saves against one of the highest-scoring teams in Oregon. On Thursday Wilson was beaten by a very strong returning State Champion team from Oregon City. Again, Wilson was led by McCaslin with four goals and Dearth and Sauter with a goal each. Hats off to Wilson for its great season and kudos to head coach **Sarah Bromley** who brought the team to the State finals in only her second season as coach! Wilson will miss our graduating seniors but promises to be back next season with another very strong team.
