WILSON STRINGS PROGRAM GIVES STUDENTS CHANCE TO MAKE MUSIC

YOUTH SERVICE AMERICA ACCEPTING APPLICATIONS FOR GLOBAL DISNEY FRIENDS FOR CHANGE GRANTS

The Walt Disney Company and Youth Service America are inviting applications for this year's second round of Disney Friends for Change Grants. The Friends for Change program funds youth-led fall service projects that focus on making environmentally friendly changes and engaging youth between the ages of 5 and 18 as leaders in their community. NIKE AND OREGON COMMUNITY FOUNDATION LAUNCH NIKE EMPLOYEE GRANT FUND

Nike Inc. and the Oregon Community Foundation have announced the launch of the Nike Employee Grant Fund, a \$1.5 million fund to benefit Portland and Vancouver schools and nonprofits. The Nike Employee Grant Fund will award as much as \$500,000 a year through approximately fifty grants over two grant cycles for the next three years to nonprofits and schools dedicated to sport and physical activity. The fund will make awards twice annually to nonprofits and schools in communities where local Nike employees live — Clackamas, Columbia, Multnomah, Washington, and Yamhill counties in Oregon, and Clark County in Washington. The program's four funding priorities are the environment, education, inclusion, and health. Eighty percent of the funding will go to organizations that use sports/physical activity to effect change; the remaining 20 percent will go to organizations with projects that have the potential to make a broader, long-term impact on the health and well-being of children and families.
