WILSON TEACHER RECEIVES FULBRIGHT AWARD AND HEADS TO INDIA

Tracy Groom Wilson English teacher has been awarded a Fulbright Teacher Exchange grant to teach in New Delhi, India. Mr. Groom is one of approximately 60 US citizens who will travel abroad for the 2010-11 academic year through the Fulbright Classroom Teacher Exchange Program. Tracy was selected for this award based on his professional achievement, as well as his demonstrated leadership potential in his field. According to the Fulbright program, by living and working abroad, exchange teachers gain an understanding and appreciation of different educational systems and cultures, and enrich their schools and communities by providing students with new perspectives about the world in which they live. As Tracy heads to India, an exchange teacher from the Fulbright program comes to Wilson. Wilson's exchange teacher is **Rumna Lala from New Delhi, India**. Congratulations, Tracy! Welcome Rumna!

NEW E-MENTORING PROGRAM FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

LifeWorks® E-mentoring is an online mentoring program for U.S. high school and college students who are interested in behavioral and social science, biomedical science, dental, and healthcare careers. Through this program sponsored by the National Institutes of Health (NIH) Office of Science Education, students are linked via e-mail with e-mentors (health professionals) who provide them with relevant information, guidance and support. E-mentoring takes place on a secured Internet Web site managed by the NIH. The program aims to offer students a safe place to receive professional and ongoing support as they strive for academic and career success.

- help students discover talents and interests, and define their goals
- · share their knowledge, experiences, and wisdom as role models of success
- · provide valuable opportunities by facilitating academic, career, and personal contacts
- stimulate curiosity and build confidence by presenting new ideas, opportunities, and challenges
- · encourage growth and achievement by providing a supportive environment

Is it Safe to Use This Web site?

To ensure student safety, all prospective mentors are screened against the Dru Sjodin National Sex Offender database of the United States Department of Justice. NIH also reviews mentors' personal references and their academic and employment histories. As another safety measure, e-mails between mentor and student will pass through a private and secure Web site managed by the NIH. All communications between mentor and student must be limited to the registered e-mail address at this Web site.

What do I need to get started?

• Students must be at least 16 years old and if you are under 18 years old, obtain a parent's or legal guardian's consent to participate.

· Students need an e-mail account, which can be obtained free from most Internet service providers.

• Students need access to a computer with Internet connection, at least on an occasional basis through your school, local library, work or home.
