Dianna is survived by her husband, Mike Ponder; parents, Merlin and Mary Ragsdill; daughter, Merry Graham; stepsons, Sean and Evan Ponder; sisters, Christie Claassen and Brenda Perry; uncles and aunts, Loren and Veneta Leshner and Darrell and Emily Woolsey; cousins, Dave and Darlene Shepherd, Dave Leshner, Brad Leshner, and Judy Brooke; and nieces and nephews, Heather, Adrienne, Bryan, and Jeremy. HILLSDALE COMMUNITY CHURCH ... IT STARTED WITH AN ORGAN

Since a new pipe organ was installed in early 2009, the retired organ console had been gathering dust and taking up space in a corner of the lobby at Hillsdale Community Church, United Church of Christ. When artist and church member Evan Holt got a look at the 1947 oak console, his face lit up as he spoke two words, "A challenge!" Weeks later, the console has been transformed into mirrors, tables, a lamp, a bench, a couple of shelves and a mobile, all using only wood from the organ. The once-dusty corner has been transformed into an art show entitled, "7487: Deconstructed/ Reconstructed." 7487 is the makers' mark found on all parts of a pipe organ console. "My goal was to stretch the useful limits of what would otherwise be considered scrap material," says Holt. "Some wood has been refinished and some has been left to show the sixty-three years of use as a pipe organ, including a burnt spot on one of the mirrors from an errant candle." Church pastor Rev. Jennifer Brownell concurs with Holt's vision, which she likens to the spiritual walk. "Not only are the pieces themselves breathtaking, but they are such a great example of the innovation we like to encourage in all areas of our congregation's life - honoring what has been passed down to us by previous generations, while always creating something new." Evan Holt is a local artist specializing in fine wood furniture and finish carpentry. He is currently pursuing a Master of Fine Arts degree through the Pacific Northwest College of Art's Applied Craft & Design program. He operates Holt Woodworks, focusing on carpentry projects and artistic custom furniture, with an eye towards environmentally friendly construction. Pieces are available for viewing free of charge during office hours (Monday – Friday, 10-2) until Friday, September 10 at Hillsdale Community Church - UCC (6948 SW Capitol Hwy, Portland). They will be sold in a silent auction benefiting the church's organ fund on Sunday, September 12 beginning at 9:00 am and ending at noon.
