The suspects include the newly married couple who run the house, and the suspicions that are in their minds nearly wreck their perfect marriage. Others are a spinster with a curious background, an architect who seems better equipped to be a chef, a retired Army major, a strange little man who claims his car has overturned in a drift, and a jurist who makes life miserable for everyone. Into their midst comes a policeman, traveling on skis. He no sooner arrives, than the jurist is killed. Two down, and one to go. To get to the rationale of the murderer's pattern, the policeman probes the background of everyone present, and rattles a lot of skeletons. Another famous Agatha Christie switch finish! Chalk up another superb intrigue for the foremost mystery writer of her time. Originally performed at Wilson under the direction of longtime director Julie Accuardi, The Mousetrap is a crowd favorite. The Mousetrap runs October 31, November 1, 7, and 8 with shows beginning at 7:00pm, and November 2 and 9 with shows beginning at 2:00pm. Tickets are \$10 for general admission and \$5 for students/faculty, on sale at the door only, and all performances take place in the Cosgrove Auditorium on the campus of Wilson High School. PPS SEEKS INPUT ON SCHOOL RENOVATION CRITERIA

The Portland School Board is seeking public input on staff-developed criteria to prioritize major facility improvements across the district. Once finalized, the criteria will guide Portland Public Schools as it develops an ordered list for school renovations or rebuilding. PPS staff began 18 months ago to identify deficiencies and needs of the district's 85-plus schools, then presented the information at schools and worked with the public to develop recommendations for each building. The recommendations to rebuild or renovate largely depend on the overall condition of the buildings. The order of work, however, will depend on additional factors such as geographic location, prior commitments and the availability of temporary space, to name a few. There will be an opportunity for public testimony at the September 29 school board meeting, which begins at 7pm at the Blanchard Education Service Center, 501 N.
