PORTLAND SPORTS AND FITNESS FESTIVAL

Another event that is coming up this next weekend is the Portland Sports and Fitness Festival. It will be a sports extravaganza held at the Memorial Coliseum on Saturday, January 17 from 9am-6pm, and Sunday, January 18 from 9am-5pm. There will be 18 different fitness stations set up around the coliseum, music provided by a local station, and a demonstration field and stage. 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SPANISH IMMERSION COURSE IN MADRID THIS SUMMER

Clifton Chestnut from Grammata Servicios Linguisticos is organizing a Spanish immersion course in Madrid this summer for Portlandarea high school students. Students will sample some of Spain's most delicious cuisine, contemplate some of the country's most celebrated art and visit some of its most spectacular monuments, all while immersing themselves in the Spanish language. The course runs from June 11 to July 12, 2009. The course fee including round-trip airfare is \$4,480. Space is limited to 20 students and is designed for students with at least one year of Spanish. The course fee includes: Round-trip coach airfare from Portland to Madrid, Spain with an English-speaking Grammata representative on board; Welcome celebration in Madrid; Full room and board with a Spanish host family carefully screened by our staff and matched with the visiting student; 48 hours of Spanish instruction by native instructors in our center; Transport to and from our center and the student's homestay; \$100,000 of medical insurance coverage for the duration of the program; Guided visits to Toledo, Segovia and El Escorial, destinations easily reached from Madrid by modern, high-speed rail; Tours and activities in Madrid led by our staff; Supervision by Grammata staff and an individual progress report, plus diploma for each participant at the program's end; Optional excursions for an additional fee (to be announced). Their local representative in Portland will present detailed information on the course during TWO information sessions scheduled for the following dates and times: Thursday January 15, 2009 from 7 p.m. to 8 p.m. at CubeSpace PDX, 622 SE Grand Avenue, Portland, OR 97214, Persian Conference Room.
