Another Wilson graduate heads to the Oregon State Legislature! **Margaret Doherty '68** was recently appointed as the next State Representative for House District 35 in the Oregon State Legislature. Washington and Multnomah county commissioners unanimously selected Margaret to replace outgoing state Rep. Larry Galizio. She joins two other Wilson graduates in the current Oregon legislature: senator_Ginny_Burdick '65, District 18 (Tigard, King City and SW Portland) and Representative Chris Garrett '92, District: 38 (City of Lake Oswego and a portion of SW Portland). After graduating from Wilson, Margaret went to Portland State University and received a degree in Speech and Theater. She taught Speech, English and History at Milwaukie High School for 10 years, then went to work as a labor consultant with the Oregon Education Association for the next 22 years. In that position, Margaret represented education workers in many part of the State. She retired in 2006 and began a floral design business. Margaret has always been active in politics in Oregon. Since Margaret ended up majoring in speech, her two most influential teachers at Wilson were Mr. Pacheco and Mrs Zervis. "After working with teachers all of my adult life, I truly appreciate what wonderful and dedicated teachers we did have," states Margaret. "They really were not making much money back then, yet they were dedicated to making sure we got the most out of an education." When asked about advice for current Wilson students, Margaret tells us that "You never know where you are going to end up in life. I never thought I would be a state representative. Make the most of the opportunities you have been given."

ROSE FESTIVAL COURT SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The Rose Festival Court is comprised of up to 15 outstanding women who are selected from Portland-Metro area high schools. After being selected in March, court members attend after-school and evening orientation meetings during the month of April. Beginning May 1, court members travel full-time 6 days a week for 6 weeks, visiting community events, business leaders, hospitals, senior living centers, youth organizations and civic groups. Court members also receive one-on-one mentorship form Pacific Power's senior management team, a \$3,500 scholarship valid for any accredited college, a complete wardrobe including shoes and accessories, and a lifetime of enduring friendships with their Rose Festival Court sisters. To be considered for the court all candidates must: Be Female; Be a senior graduating in June 2010 or junior on track to graduate in June 2011; Have a minimum of a 3.0 cumulative GPA; 20 hours of community service performed during high school; Submit a complete application by December 18, 2009 (applications are available in the main office or online at http://www.rosefestival.org/events/rosecourt/); Attend one mandatory orientation session in January 2010; Participate in the court selection process (Judging on character, communication, and presence). The Southwest and East Portland Sidewalk Infill Project will construct sidewalks, including **several segments along SW Barbur Blvd, SW Luradel**. The project will construct concrete sidewalks and corner curb ramps compliant with the Americans with Disabilities Act, stormwater management facilities and small retaining walls where necessary. The project will not complete all sidewalk segments on these streets. However, it will address many gaps where there is existing curb, existing public right-of-way and it is feasible to include the segment in the project.
