WILSON GRADUATE NAMED AP SCHOLAR WITH DISTINCTION

Another Wilson grad has earned special recognition by the College Board for exceptional achievement on Advanced Placement exams. **Austin Alleman '09** was named AP Scholar with Distinction (average grade of at least 3.5 on all AP Exams taken, and grades of 3 or higher on five or more of those exams). He is currently a freshman at Santa Clara University, where he earned more than 20 college credits because of the AP exams he took while at Wilson. Austin is in the honors program at Santa Clara University, studying Mechanical Engineering. Austin took and scored 4 or more on the following AP courses at Wilson: Calculus AB; Calculus BC; US History; Microeconomics; Macroeconomics; English Literature. Austin's parents, **Ken and Heidi Alleman**, have really appreciated the wide variety of Advanced Placement courses available to students at Wilson and the staff's commitment to the program. They tell us that, "in each AP class at Wilson, the teacher encourages students to take the AP exam and teaches with the goal that every student will be prepared to take the exam at the end of the course if they choose to. Participation in the AP program at Wilson certainly has prepared Austin for college coursework and given him a tremendous head start in college. Because he took so many AP exams during his time at Wilson, and was so well-prepared for them, Austin has received a number of college credits, satisfying many of his college undergrad requirements. This has allowed him to take more advanced coursework his freshman year in college and freed his schedule to allow him to explore electives and activities he otherwise would not have been able to his first year." PSAT/NMSQT OCTOBER 14

The Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT) will be given to **all sophomores**, on **Wednesday, October 14, at Wilson High**. Portland Public Schools provides this test, **at no charge**, to all sophomores. Each high school will administer it to their own students on this day. **Juniors are encouraged to sign up to take the test** as well, for a chance to **compete for the National Merit Scholarship**. The **cost is \$20 for juniors** to take the test and you can **sign up** with our **bookkeeper now through October 7**. Juniors, remember ... even if you took the PSAT as a sophomore only scores from the PSAT/NMSQT taken in your junior year are considered for the National Merit Scholarship competition. The [Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test](#) is a practice SAT test. It measures the critical reading, math problem-solving, and writing skills that you've been developing throughout your life. All grades will have school that day and changes to the schedule will be explained in advance.

The Portland Bureau of Transportation is hosting a public open house for the Southwest and East Portland Sidewalk Infill Project. The Southwest and East Portland Sidewalk Infill Project will construct sidewalks, including **several segments along SW Barbur Blvd, SW Luradel.** The project will construct concrete sidewalks and corner curb ramps compliant with the Americans with Disabilities Act, stormwater management facilities and small retaining walls where necessary. The project will not complete all sidewalk segments on these streets. However, it will address many gaps where there is existing curb, existing public right-of-way and it is feasible to include the segment in the project. The Southwest and East Portland Sidewalk Infill Project is funded by the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA).
