The legendary Mel Brown Septet will follow at 8:00pm (\$6.00 cover). Ryan has been a member of Portland Public School music programs since 7th grade. His love for jazz was initially inspired and encouraged by Jackson Middle School Band Director, David Stone. Since then he has studied jazz music at Wilson High School with Paul Jolstead, Metropolitan Youth Jazz Orchestra, The Alan Jones Academy of Music, The PDX Jazz Project, Portland Youth Jazz Orchestra, Portland State University, and with private instructors Gordon Lee, Farnell Newton, Randy Porter, and Alan Jones. In 2009 he was a member of the All State Honor Band and was a finalist for the 2009 Grammy Band. He has been selected for the 2010 Oregon Music All-State Honor Jazz Band. <u>PDX Jazz Project</u> is an organization for youth ages 13 to 18, designed to preserve & forward the history of jazz music through performance, education and community events in metropolitan Portland, Oregon.
