Rehearsals for Wilson's winter musical, *Rent*, have started with performances scheduled for February 19-22 and February 26 through March 1. All Sundays listed are Matinee performances. TEEN DRIVERS SKILLS CLINIC FEBRUARY 28

The Teen Drivers Skills Clinic is being held on Saturday, February 28 from 7am to Noon at the Portland International Raceway. The program consists of a short (90 minute) classroom session and then teens are put behind the wheels of their cars to practice what they were taught. Students age 16-21 years of age with a valid drivers license and proof of insurance may attend. Students under 18 must have their parents' permission and a signed Minor Waiver form. The program costs \$65 per student. What should the student drive? Your family car or daily driver. Every car has unique handling characteristics and they want students to be comfortable in the car where they spend most of their time. What else should the student bring? Layered clothing appropriate for the weather. Water and snacks. A helmet if you have one (they will have helmets to loan). A photocopy of your driver's license and your proof of insurance. The Minor Waiver signed by both parents (or a signed affirmation from single parents stating that they are the sole parent or guardian). SPANISH IMMERSION COURSE IN MADRID THIS SUMMER

There are still spaces available for the Spanish immersion course organized by Grammata Servicios Linguisticos. Students will sample some of Spain's most delicious cuisine, contemplate some of the country's most celebrated art and visit some of its most spectacular monuments, all while immersing themselves in the Spanish language.
