COLORADO RAPIDS TAKE WILSON GRAD FOR MAJOR LEAGUE SOCCER SUPERDRAFT

According to the University of Redlands, the Colorado Rapids selected Wilson graduate Ross Schunk '05 for the 2009 Major League Soccer (MLS) SuperDraft. Ross is a senior at the University of Redlands and is a forward on the men's soccer team. Schunk received an invitation to work out at the MLS combine. No other NCAA Division III student-athlete received an invitation to the combine nor was selected in the 2009 SuperDraft. "When I saw my name come up on my screen, I was in shock," Schunk said. "It was one of the happiest moments in my life; it was a joy." Schunk said that while Colorado was making the pick, Rapids Head Coach Gary Smith called him up on his cell phone to notify him of the selection. As a drafted player, Schunk gains an invitation to Colorado's training camp. Ross started his first day of on-field training on January 28. As a student-athlete at the University of Redlands, Ross set the career program record for goals (63) and points (139) while garnering three First-Team All-Southern California Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (SCIAC) honors, two SCIAC Player of the Year awards, two College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA)/ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District recognitions, three National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA)/adidas® All-Far West Region laurels and two NSCAA/adidas® All-American nominations. Tony Betts, Wilson Men's Soccer coach states that In the 20 years of coaching soccer at Wilson there have been only a few players that had the potential of playing professional. "Ross was one of them as he stood out on the field not just because of his individual skills but because of his determination and never wanting to lose," adds Tony. "He led by example and gave 100% in training as well as in games, which is very rare for many talented players today, but his desire was so strong to succeed, learn and improve each day. I'm not surprised he was drafted in to the MLS and I wish him all the best in the future. Now if he wore PUMA shoes he might get signed by an EPL team!!" Congratulations to Ross and his parents!

SPANISH IMMERSION COURSE IN MADRID THIS SUMMER

There are still spaces available for the Spanish immersion course organized by Grammata Servicios Linguisticos. Students will sample some of Spain's most delicious cuisine, contemplate some of the country's most celebrated art and visit some of its most spectacular monuments, all while immersing themselves in the Spanish language.
