WILSON PARENT EXPANDS LOCAL MEDICAL CLINIC

The <u>Hillsdale News</u> recently reported that the Fanno Creek Clinic is expanding. **Dr. Gregg Coodley**, Wilson parent, who founded the clinic and manages it, noted that the construction work and the enlargement of the clinic's staff will help "get the economy moving again." Construction began in early March on a 2500-square-foot addition to the Fanno Creek Clinic at 2400 SW Vermont. Construction is estimated to last four months and cost \$500,000. The new wing will add 12 exam rooms and an expanded waiting area for the clinic's laboratory. The extra space will allow the 12-year-old clinic to institute a pediatrics department. The Clinic currently employs a staff of 50. Included in the number are 11 primary care practitioners as well as specialists in Cardiology, ENT, Gastroenterology, Psychiatry and Podiatry.

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HOST STUDENT FROM SPAIN THIS SUMMER

Grammata Servicios Lingüisticos is looking for host families for high school students from Spain for this summer. Ideally, host families should have at least one teenager in the home, provide a private bedroom for the student and live within a reasonable walking distance of a Tri-Met transit stop. Students arrive in Portland on July 1, 2009 and depart from Portland on Tuesday, July 28, 2009. There is a Host family stipend of \$275 to help defray costs. As last year's host families will attest, taking in a student provided a fantastic opportunity to learn about Spanish culture. Likewise, the visiting students took full advantage of the chance to immerse themselves in American culture and improve their English, an essential skill for the business world.
