FRESHMAN DRIVES TO TOP-FIVE FINISHES AT STOCKTON 99 SPEEDWAY

According to Raymond Rendleman, The Southwest Community Connection, WHS freshman **Keegan Walmer** is the youngest member of a national development team for NASCAR racers. After a race season kick-off party on April 10 at Cider Mill Restaurant, owned by Wilson grad Toby Harris '89, Keegan and his family headed to Stockton for the first Norcal USAC race. According to Steven Blakesley from Norcalmedia, 14 year-old Keegan Walmer drove to a pair of top-five finishes in the USAC Young Guns and USAC Western Pavement Ford Focus Midget Series races at Stockton 99 Speedway in Stockton. He also finished second in the 15 lap Young Gun feature and fifth in the 40 lap Western Pavement feature. Keegan began by setting the fastest time with a lap of 14.342 seconds around the quarter-mile asphalt oval. He followed that up with a win in the trophy dash. "Keegan's talent at qualifying a race car is breathtaking," said Driver Coach Ron Sutton. "Once he gets the dust blown off from last season he is going to be a force to be reckoned with!"
