Heading to the 6A Baseball State Championships playoff, Wilson will host a Second round State playoff game on Tuesday, May 26, at 4:30pm, opponent to be determined by the winner of a game to be played by other teams on Friday, May 22. The Wilson championship team is led by seniors Stuart Fewel, first-team all State pitcher last year, and Bailey Graham, second-team all-State Catcher last year.
