ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT

After Kris Van Auken (Nelsen) '86 graduated from Wilson, she received a Music Ed. degree from Pacific Lutheran University in Tacoma, WA. After college Kris taught elementary music in the Evergreen School District in Vancouver, WA while earning her master's degree at Lewis and Clark College. Kris then taught elementary music in Oregon City and North Clackamas and at Oregon Episcopal School, where she still teaches an after school choir. Currently she is the Artistic Director of the Oregon Repertory Singers Youth Choirs, where children K-12 grades sing in six choirs. It is a community, tuition-based choir and kids come from all over the Portland metropolitan area to rehearse once a week and sing in several concerts in Portland during the school year. Go to:

www.orsingers.org to learn more. When asked about favorite teachers, Kris said that Merle Lotz, her choir teacher, had the biggest influence on her at Wilson. "He and his wife Pat gave me some wonderful opportunities to accompany the choirs on piano, as well as sing some very high quality music during my high school years," states Kris. "This was a huge influence on my choice of career."

We also asked Kris if she had any words of wisdom for Wilson students. "I would advise current Wilson students to pursue their dreams and to look at life with an open mind," she adds. "Don't get stuck with a small, select group of people, as it will narrow your opportunities and your outlook on all that the world has to offer."

WILSON MOVES TO 5A IN PIL

Here's the latest update on the OSAA Re-Classification process and the impact on Wilson. The OSAA has provided Wilson with the updated enrollment numbers they will use for re-classification for the 2010-2014 classification time block. The enrollment numbers for each classification have been adjusted downward from previous years. [New 6A cutoff: 1480; New 5A cutoff: 855-1479] The new cutoff numbers have Wilson, with an ADM (Average Daily Membership) of 1448. That places Wilson in the 5A Classification. Wilson has the choice to stay at the 5A level or opt to play up at the 6A level. The schools that we schedule for athletic competition will remain the same as they have been, and the PIL will become one of the Hybrid Leagues that contain 6A, 5A and 4 A schools. You can find out more about the reclassifications and how the different leagues will be reconfigured by going to the OSAA website: http://www.osaa.org/governance/committees/classification/proposals.asp. The Wilson Administration, after much discussion with the Wilson Athletic Director and coaches, has elected to stay at the 5A level where our enrollment places Wilson. We will play in a league consisting of Wilson, Franklin, Benson, Cleveland, Jefferson and Madison. The entire P.I.L. will be involved in a hybrid league allowing all of the traditional rivalries to continue. The advantages to playing 5A are many. All of Wilson's programs will be more competitive and have the opportunity for greater success in playoff situations by competing with schools that are more like sized. Wilson feels that across the board all of our programs will prosper from playing schools with similar enrollments rather than against those that have twice the enrollment and resources.
