WILSON STUDENTS NAMED AP SCHOLARS

Wilson High School has a long history of offering students college-level Advanced Placement (AP) courses. These AP courses help students gain the edge in college preparation, stand out in the college application process, and earn credit or advanced standing at most of the nation's colleges and universities. We recently were notified that two Wilson students have been named AP Scholars by the College Board. Please join us in congratulating these outstanding Wilson AP students! We also would like to acknowledge that teachers throughout the Wilson cluster play an invaluable role in laying the foundation for success in high school, and the role of our parents for the success of our students can never be understated.

Jillian Prouty '09 has been named an **AP Scholar** - granted to students who receive grades of 3 or higher on three or more AP Exams. Jillian scored 3 and above in the following exams: Biology, Calculus BC, Chemistry, English Lit and Comp, Studio Art: Drawing, and US History. Congratulations to Jullian and her parents, **Edith and John Prouty**.

Madeline Greaves, Wilson senior, has been named an **AP Scholar with Honor** by the College Board. AP Scholar with Honor is granted to students who receive an average grade of at least 3.25 on all AP Exams taken, and grades of 3 or higher on five or more of these exams. Madeline scored 3 and above in the following exams: Calculus AB, Government and Politics: Comparative, Government and Politics: US, Spanish Language, and US History. Congratulations to Madeline and her parents, **Georgia and David Greaves**.

Wilson High School's commitment to strong academics says David Greaves, Wilson parent, is evident from the large variety and quality AP classes offered to students. "Teachers take these classes seriously and understand that part of their role is to prepare students for the year-end AP tests," adds David. "We were impressed that at every back-to-school night for the past three years, every one of Maddy's AP teachers have discussed preparation for the AP tests. Throughout the year they have also provided encouragement and support to Maddy and the other students, including helpful motivation to take the AP tests. Maddy was always encouraged to pursue as many AP tests as she was willing to take; the fact that Wilson students have a high passing rate helped her become enthusiastic about the process. Maddy took her first AP test after her Sophomore year; since it went well, she tried a few more after her Junior year. They went well, too. She says she is not done yet! Another important part of Maddy's success can be attributed to the support she receives from her track coaches and school club sponsors. They have always allowed her to prioritize academics as necessary yet still participate in the activities that provide a rounded education experience. 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PSAT/NMSQT OCTOBER 14

The Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT) will be given to **all sophomores**, on **Wednesday**, **October 14**, **at Wilson** High. Portland Public Schools provides this test, **at no charge**, to all sophomores. Each high school will administer it to their own students on this day.

Juniors are encouraged to sign up to take the test as well, for a chance to compete for the National Merit Scholarship. The cost is \$20 for juniors to take the test and you can sign up with our bookkeeper now through October 7. Juniors, remember ... even if you took the PSAT as a sophomore only scores from the PSAT/NMSQT taken in your junior year are considered for the National Merit Scholarship competition.

The <u>Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test</u> is a practice SAT test. It measures the critical reading, math problem-solving, and writing skills that you've been developing throughout your life. All grades will have school that day and changes to the schedule will be explained in advance.
