WILSON STUDENTS IMPRESS AT SYSTEM DYNAMICS CONFERENCE

Wilson students made a big splash at the International System Dynamics Conference in Albuquerque in July 2009. To a standing-room-only crowd, Marcus Robinson '09, James Ranney '09, and Joseph Kibe '07 presented the system dynamics models they had created while seniors at Wilson. Kudos go to Wilson's speech and debate coach, Matt Compton, whose speech instruction contributed to the students' very effective presentations. It was suggested that these students could teach other presenters at the conference a thing or two. In the afternoon, on Wednesday, July 29, there was also a K-12 poster session where students displayed models. Henry Li '12 participated in the poster session, as did Marcus, James, and Joseph. The students, again, represented Wilson well as they successfully explained their models and fielded questions from engineers from Sandia, Argonne, and other National Labs, professors from MIT and many other universities, and business people from around the world. The student models presented were:

James Ranney '09: What is the Impact of Introducing an Invasive Species Into an Ecosystem?

Marcus Robinson '09: How Much do Carbon Emissions Need to be Reduced in Order to Stop Global Warming?

Henry Li '12: The Transportation of Milk - How is it Impacting our Environment?

Joseph Kibe '07: Can automakers cope with the increasing demand for hybrid gasoline-electric vehicles?

Other students' models, created in the Wilson System Dynamics Modeling course, were also displayed at the poster session. An engineer from Sandia National Labs asked for **Travis Mandel's '07** paper on 'Breaches in Airport Security' because his group at Sandia was building a similar model and it contained some of the same components found in Mandel's model. Other requests were made for modeling students' work.

REMINDERS ABOUT FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL

To help ease the 1st day of school transition, here are some updates. Thank you for supporting Wilson High School. We are looking forward to working with you!

- 1. **Make-Up Registration**: If you did not make it to August registration, please come to make up registration between 7:45-10am on Sept 8th. You will start the process in the cafeteria, receiving your packet and student ID card. You will then proceed to the bookkeeper to pay for supplies, and finally the textbook room for books.
- 2. All Students: You must pick up a **new Schedule** (COLOR) on the first day of school. We will begin passing out Freshman schedules at 7:45AM right outside of the Auditorium Foyer. ALL upper classmen can pick up their schedules starting at 9:00AM in the main hallway (these will be alpha by grade). **This new color schedule is your ticket into class.** If you do not pick up the new color schedule, your teacher will send you to the main hallway to pick up the fresh schedule.
- 3. **Locker** Information: We had problems with the junior class lockers. When juniors pick up their fresh schedules, the new locker and combo will be on the fresh COLOR schedule. For those of you (other than juniors) that had locker issues, we will have students, parents and a campus monitor available on Tuesday morning to help. Many of the issues are user error, so please feel free to ask for help. Just ask that you are patient while we work out the kinks.
- 4. **Lifetouch** will be here to replace ID cards on Tuesday, Sept. 8th. After Sept. 8th, we will not have the ability to replace cards until mid- October.
- 5. Show your Wilson Spirit--- This Friday, Sept. 4th at 7:30PM is the 1st home football game.
- 6. **Parking**: In the registration packets, you will find the student parking permit request form. Please fill out this form and send back to the school (main office) the first week of school. We will be assigning permits to seniors and then raffling off all remaining permits to juniors. The main parking lot is for juniors and seniors only. Sophomores may use the Mary Rieke parking lot or street parking. Parents, please remind students to not park in staff, custodial or visitor parking.
