ALL STUDENTS:

Will eat lunch at approximately 1:00, after 3rd period. Make sure to eat a good breakfast as it is later than normal. All students will have 4th period after lunch.

ALL JUNIORS:

Will be testing in either the math hall or social studies hall. A list is posted at both ends of the main hall showing which rooms juniors are testing in.

Some items for your JUNIORS to know:

- Have a good breakfast as this is a long exam. The cafeteria will serve breakfast starting at 7:45am
- Report to their assigned classroom by 8:15am
- Bring the following: Student ID, Approved Calculator, 2 pencils
- Make sure to not bring cell phones or any electronic items into the classroom
- Food/beverage can't be consumed in the testing rooms. It can remain in your backpack under your desk.
- A small snack will be provided for all students during the break in the hallway
- During the break students may not leave the testing hallway.

Freshmen, sophomores and seniors will also start their day at 8:15am as usual. Students will go to their regular schedule unless their teacher has informed them that their class is displaced to another room. Students are displaced if their teacher is proctoring the exam during 1st, 2nd, or 3rd periods. If your student has one of these classes, go to the room assigned on the Displaced List (on blue sheets) which are posted in the hallways.

Please remember, attendance will be taken for every student during the school day.
