RECENT GRADUATE VOLUNTEERS IN GHANA, WEST AFRICA

Mikaila Montgomery '10 finished up her senior classes at Wilson a semester early last year in order to earn money to go to Ghana, West Africa where she volunteered in an orphanage for 5 weeks. Mikaila and other young volunteers from around the world lived in a tiny village to the west of the capital, Accra, and together looked after 28 children from 8 months to 12 years old. They held the children, laughed with them, played games with them, took them to the medical clinic when they were ill and took them to a nearby empty lot to play soccer. In essence, the volunteers were responsible for the children's overall well being. This experience was very meaningful for Mikaila. She says that it "opened her eyes" to the complexity of the world. She became very bonded to each of the orphan children and misses them a great deal. Mikaila found her position through www.volunteerhq.org. This organization matches people (over 18 yrs.) to volunteer opportunities around the world. Mikaila is now attending the University of Victoria in British Columbia, Canada.

PSAT/NMSQT TEST @ WILSON, OCTOBER 13

All **sophomores** will take the PSAT/NMSQT test on Wednesday, October 13, at Wilson High. Oregon Dept. of Education provides this test, at no charge, to all sophomores. Each high school will administer it to their own students on this day. No pre-registration is needed for sophomores – this will happen in class.

Juniors are encouraged to sign up to take the test as well for a chance to compete for the National Merit Scholarship. The cost is \$20 for juniors to take the test and you can sign up with our bookkeeper now through October 7. If financial assistance is needed, please see Abby Menashe in the main office.

All grades will have school that day starting at 8:15am. There will be changes to the bell schedule that day which will be explained in advance.

The Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT®) is a national standardized assessment that measures the critical reading, mathematics, and writing skills your students will need for higher education and careers after high school. It provides firsthand practice for the SAT® and gain access to college and career planning tools. It also gives juniors a chance to enter NMSC scholarship programs.
