WILSON SENIOR HEADS TO ST. MARY'S COLLEGE

According to WestSideLax.com, Wilson senior **Mckenzie Hessel** has committed to play NCAA Division women's lacrosse at St. Mary's College in California. Hessel said she also considered Queens College (N.Y.) and Bard College (N.Y.). Hessel's Wilson team lost to Oregon City in the 2010 Oregon state championship game. Hessel had 61 ground balls and 19 points in 2010, when she was an Academic All-American and a second-team All-State selection. "St. Mary's offers a very unique curriculum, and I have heard good things about the schools liberal arts program, said Hessel, who plans to major in environmental science or sociology," adds Mckenzie. FREE CLASSES ON PARENTING YOUNGSTERS WITH MENTAL HEALTH ISSUES

Free Classes on Parenting Youngsters with Mental Health Issues in Hillsdale, Southwest Portland. The Multnomah chapter of the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) is offering a **free**, **six-week course for parents and caregivers of children and adolescents with mental health issues**. The NAMI Basics course was developed by mental health professionals and is taught by specially trained teachers who are themselves parents or caregivers of youngsters with serious behavioral challenges. Thursday evening **classes begin January 13** in the Hillsdale area in Southwest Portland. Exact time and location will be provided at time of registration. Registration is required; to register call 503-203-3391. The course covers a range of topics that include:

- insights into understanding the child's experience and the emotional reactions of the family;
- learning to separate the child you love from the illness that alters their behavior and abilities;
- workshops to develop problem-solving, listening and communication skills;
- current research related to the biology of mental illness and the most effective treatment strategies; and
- how to locate community supports and services for both child and family.
