PORTLAND SCHOOL BOARD INVITING TESTIMONY ON OPERATING LEVY

The Portland School Board is inviting testimony as it considers placing a local operating levy on the ballot in May to provide additional funding to protect PPS schools from expected state budget cuts. One more meeting remains where you have the opportunity to **comment: Wednesday, January 19 at 5 p.m., at the board's Finance, Audit and Operations Committee meeting**. All meetings are in the Blanchard Education Service Center, 501 N. Dixon, and will be streamed live on the PPS website and broadcast on TV28. Those wishing to speak may sign up in person before the meetings, or in advance by contacting the board office by e-mail or by calling 503-916-3741. PPS voters approved a five-year local option levy in November 2006. That levy is raising roughly \$40 million this year, paying for classroom learning materials and more than 350 teaching positions. The levy expires in June of 2012. The Portland School Board is considering asking voters in May to renew the operating levy, at the full allowable amount under new caps set by the Oregon Legislature in 2007. That would mean a rate of roughly \$1.90 per \$1,000 of taxable assessed property value, and would pay for a total of roughly 500 teaching positions – 150 more than the current levy.

SCIENCE TEACHING EXCELLENCE TO HONOR K-12 TEACHERS NOW OPEN
