WILSON CHEER HEADS TO USA NATIONALS

With a series of first-place finishes and a recent outstanding 2nd Place finish at the OSAA State Championships on February 12, the Wilson Varsity Cheer team has qualified for the USA Nationals competition for the sixth time in March. The 20-member squad has a long history of winning, including taking top-three finishes at the Oregon state championships for the past nine years. At the recent state championships, "the team performed a great routine in front of a huge crowd of Wilson supporters," adds Chris Fazzolari, Head Cheer Coach. "We were thrilled to receive the 2nd place trophy in the 5/A6/A division." Also, out of more than 50 cheer teams competing at the event, the Wilson Cheer team was named the recipient of the Lesley Maley Choreography Award. This award is voted on by the judges as the most entertaining routine to watch. This is the third time Wilson has received the award. The team is now looking forward to competing March 12 and 13 at PacWest Nationals at the Oregon Convention Center and March 25-28 at USA Nationals in Anaheim.
