WILSON SENIOR WINS SECOND PLACE IN CIVIL RIGHTS ESSAY CONTEST

Senior **Justine Silberberg** was selected as the second place winner of the 7th Annual Ancer L. Haggerty Civil Rights Essay Contest. The Honorable Ancer L. Haggerty has served as a judge in Oregon since 1989, first on the state bench, and since 1994 as a judge of the United States District Court for the District of Oregon. He is the first and only African-American to serve as a federal judge in Oregon. He also served for many years as Chief Judge of the District Court of Oregon. In honor of Judge Haggerty, the Federal Bar Association sponsors a civil rights essay contest for high school students in Oregon. This year's topic was the right to vote. Students were asked to write an essay discussing whether a person's right to vote should be affected by incarceration or a felony conviction and explain the reasoning supporting their position. A complete list of the winners follows: First Place Erik Steringer, Southridge High School; Second Place Justine Silberberg, Wilson High School; Third Place Jordan Edelson, Lincoln High School. Justine and her parents (**Jennifer and Phillip Silberberg**) will be honored on Wednesday, March 16th at the Federal Bar Association annual awards luncheon.
