CHEER REPRESENTS WILSON AND OREGON ... TAKE 5TH PLACE AT USA NATIONALS

Wilson Varsity Cheerleaders took the floor with confidence at the USA National Cheerleading Championships in Anaheim last weekend. The girls competed in the preliminaries on Saturday against 18 great teams from all over the western U.S. After watching these teams perform our coaching staff knew we would have to hit one of our best performances of the season to make it to the finals. "We hit an awesome routine then had to wait three hours before the announcement of the final eight was made," adds Head Coach Chris Fazzolari. "When Wilson High School was announced as a finalist I am sure our team, coaches, and parents were screaming the loudest! Heading into finals we were in 8th place and we knew if we hit another great routine we could move up in the final placement. The scoring system works so that 40% of your first day score is carried over to the second day and 60% of the score of your second day is combined with the first day. We performed even better the second day and moved all the way from 8th to 5th!!
