Although we don't have the final numbers in yet, it appears the Wilson Foundation did well at the auction paddle raise last Saturday evening, moving us closer to our goal of raising \$100,000 this year. Thanks to all of you who helped with that event and who donated to the Foundation.

Now that the school year is coming toward a close, Wilson Foundation volunteers would like to make one final push for the Wilson Foundation. As you have undoubtedly heard, the schools budget will be substantially diminished next year—even if the PPS school levy passes. The district is facing a potential cut of several hundred teachers and the number Wilson will lose cannot be determined until we know the outcome of the levy and the school board sets the budget. ***Even in the best case, Wilson will likely lose teachers.***

As you know, the Foundation is our best opportunity to retain Wilson teaching staff, making our final efforts even more important.

The Wilson Foundation will hold its final meeting this year tonight Monday, April 25th at 7:00 PM. Come join us—especially parents with students at Wilson for several more years. The meeting will be held at the home of Chris Dearth and Rosemary Furfey, 7022 SW 33rd Ave. We will be discussing our final fundraising push in May and the possibility of organizing house parties like the Grant Foundation just did this last weekend (see link to Grant High School TV news story below.)

INTENSIVE CHINESE LANGUAGE PSU SUMMER PROGRAM, BEGINS JUNE 20 OR JUNE 27

8 weeks for \$750. Scholarships Available. Sessions begin on June 20 or June 27 and end on August 12, 2011. Classes meet 2 hours per day, Monday – Friday at Portland State University. The class will be highly interactive, using a fun situational method of language learning. Students will receive 4 credits for the 8-week course. This program is for individuals 15 or older with an interest in learning Chinese. Participants should have no background in Chinese. Students will be expected to spend about 2 hours everyday on self-managed study. COST: \$500 for 4 credits plus a \$250 lab fee. Books are about \$50. The lead teacher will be Prof. Hao-Hsiang Liao from Ohio State University who has taught Chinese at Harvard and Williams College. He will be joined by teacher-trainees of the PSU/ALLEX teacher training program.
