WILSON DESTINATION IMAGINATION (DI) TEAM GOING TO GLOBAL FINALS

Wilson High School's Destination Imagination team won first place at the state competition in Corvallis, April 9th and is going to the Global Finals in May. Destination ImagiNation is the world leader in providing real-world experience in creativity, teamwork and problem solving. Their programs, resources and services reach people of all ages across the United States and 30+ countries. Wilson's team members are sophomores, Ed Crouser, Jon Crouser, Nathan Palmrose and Amy Whetter from Wilson and Caitie Baglien from St Mary's Academy. The Spirit of DI Award was given to the Wilson group for their teamwork and presentation during their instant challenge. They used The Stick, Bucket and String approach to solving their main challenge, Unidentified Moving Object. The main challenge was handled by Jon Crouser, Ed Crouser and Caitie Baglien, while Nathan Palmrose and Amy Whetter presented the required and hilarious sales pitch. The challengers must move items from the bottom of a 8 ft tower to a holding area at the base and move items up to the top of the tower into a specific area for each item. Without their feet leaving the floor, using no electricity, they must make and use a mechanical device that can not touch the side of the tower and move the objects without the contestants touching the objects. All items used in the challenge must fit into a specific size box and this is a timed challenge where all items used must be in the box when time is called. Our team met the challenge almost perfectly. The tower height will be raised to 10 feet at Globals. The team managers, Brenda Crouser and Ricka Palmrose and all 5 team members will be going to Knoxville, TN in late May for Global Finals. Congrats and Good Luck!
