WILSON FOUNDATION SUPPORTS TEACHERS

The Superintendant's proposed budget for has been released for the coming year. Since the State allocations for schools is short of what will be needed to support schools at current levels, teaching positions will be lost and class sizes increased. Even if the local option levy is passed on the 17th, Wilson will lose teaching positions in the coming year.

The good news is that Wilson parents have an effective means of supporting our teachers and keeping class sizes down. The Wilson Foundation provides funding which will allow Principal Sue Brent to retain teaching positions and classes which might otherwise be lost.

The Wilson Foundation is about half way toward its goal of raising \$100,000 this year. Foundation volunteers will be calling Wilson parents in one final push during the week of May 23rd to reach our goal and to retain Wilson teachers. 8 weeks for \$750. Scholarships Available. Sessions begin on June 20 or June 27 and end on August 12, 2011. Classes meet 2 hours per day, Monday – Friday at Portland State University. The class will be highly interactive, using a fun situational method of language learning. Students will receive 4 credits for the 8-week course.
