WILSON FOUNDATION WORKS TO RETAIN STAFF FOR NEXT YEAR

Wilson will have to cut as many as five teaching positions next year. The proposed staffing cuts mean class size will climb about 5-6 students in each class to an average of 30. In other words, many classes will climb into the high 30's.
