Wilson's budget will be cut dramatically next year, causing the loss of an estimated five teaching positions and an increase in class size an average of 5-6 students, sending some class sizes into the mid to high-30's. Scam alert from the Counseling Department at Wilson: A parent wanted to inform Wilson and parents about a scam phone call he received today from 469-547-6860. "A man claimed he was my child's SAT counselor and there was an exam coming up. I knew this was bogus since she's just a freshman. He kept saying as part of our service we would be receiving 12 CD's of study materials in the mail. He tried throwing a lot of information at me like SAT times and dates and when I challenged him on his information he hung up. I looked the number up on the web and found many other parents indicating the same thing. They also call from several other 800 numbers." **Parents: please contact your school counselor about any of these types of phone calls or mail solicitation. There are a number of these scams that pop up periodically.** Last year, a solicitor promised a parent that with his counsel, he could get her daughter into Stanford."
